Red Pear Cherry Tomato - One of the oldest American heirlooms dating back to the 1700's. Big, prolific, regular leaf, sprawling plant produces hundreds of cute, deep-red, 1/2" x 1 1/2" pear-shaped fruits with wonderfully sweet and juicy flesh. A wonderful snacking or salad tomato that really fancies up a salad when served whole. *(excerpt from www.tomatofest.com)*

Paul Robeson Tomato – This Russian heirloom was made available by Marina Danilenko, a Moscow seeds woman. This favorite heirloom tomato was named after the operatic artist who won acclaim as an equal rights advocate. His artistry was admired world-wide, especially in the Soviet Union. This black beefsteak tomato is slightly flattened, round, and grows to 7 – 10 oz in 75 days. It's deep, rich colors stand it apart from others... a dusky, dark-red, with dark-green shoulders, and red flesh in its center. Very flavorful fruits with luscious, earthy, exotic flavors and good acid/sweet balance. Paul Robeson (aka Pol Robeson) won "Best of Show" at Carmel TomatoFest. As this tomato variety originates from Siberia and sets fruits at lower temps, it is an excellent choice for cooler growing regions. *(excerpt from www.tomatofest.com)*

Sioux Tomato - One of the best-known historic tomatoes, the medium-sized 6 oz fruits are early and bright red. Productive plants and great flavor made this one of the most popular Midwestern tomatoes in the late 1940's. In 1947, Oscar H. Will & Co. stated, "It out-yielded all other varieties in South Dakota trials." Per Henderson & Co., in 1951, "Two weeks earlier than Marglobe or Rutgers." This tomato that yields in 70 – 80 days was one of our most requested, as people love the smooth, beautiful fruit and heavy yields. Introduced in 1944 by the University of Nebraska.
